Divine Mercy

Meditation

Forgiveness is the most beautiful flower of Christianity and of Paradise; it grows in no other field.

Nonetheless, we all have a natural repugnance toward forgiving others. What can we do to conquer this instinctive repugnance to forgiving the wrongs that our neighbor has done us? Our Lord invites us to reflect on the way God treats us, we who are sinners. Yes: even if it does not seem to us that we are guilty of many sins, we must never forget that every sin offends the divine majesty, our God who is so great, so holy, so good. Toward Him, we are indebted beyond what we could possibly pay. This is what Jesus willed to teach us in the parable which the Church offers us in the Gospel of this Sunday. Here we have an image of the mercy which God showers upon us. Indeed, God is infinitely merciful. The first of all miseries is nothingness, if we can even call it a misery, since every misery supposes some degree of being. And so, Creation was the first act of God's mercy. Left to itself, any creature would fall immediately back into nothingness. And behold, God maintains all creatures in existence. More than that, He has raised creation to the level of grace by communicating supernatural life to us. Yet this was not enough for His love. God is the

goal of our life, and He willed also to be the way. Our earth has contemplated Him; His voice echoed in the air of this world; men witnessed Him passing from the cradle to the cross, from the cross to the altar, from the altar to our hearts.

“Calvary! A God nailed to the redemptive cross! A God avenging on Himself the iniquities which we committed, through a death which astonishes the divine majesty, disarms divine justice, and rains down on guilty humanity a forgiveness with no limits in time or in space or even in the gravity of crime – this is the last word of divine mercy, perpetually offended.” (H.E. Bishop Joseph Rumeau, *Pastoral Letter*, 1934) But just as we benefit from His mercy, God expects us to forgive in our turn those who have offended us.

Resolutions

- 1 To sing a *Magnificat*, blessing God for His great mercy toward us.
- 2 To recite attentively during Mass the prayers that call upon the divine mercy: *Kyrie, Gloria, Agnus Dei...*
- 3 To show mercy toward those who irritate us or do things that frustrate us.

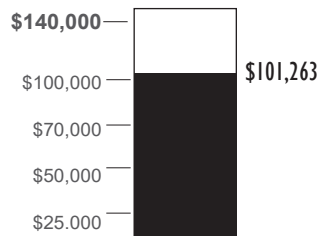
