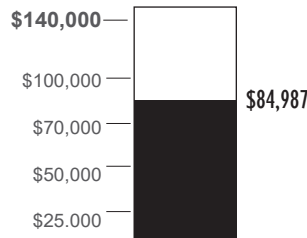

Our Lady of the Rosary



Meditation

The Rosary was instituted in the 13th century by St. Dominic by the order of Our Lady to fight against the Albigensians. In 1571, St. Pius V launched a Rosary crusade to prevent the Muslims from invading Western Europe. He himself engaged in this battle by furnishing twelve galleys, 3,000 men, and 270 horses.

Over the course of the Battle of Lepanto, 30,000 Turks met their death, while on the Christian side the losses were evaluated at 7,500. The Catholics won a brilliant victory. Pope Clement XI also attributed to the Rosary the victory of Charles VI, Holy Roman Emperor, over the Turkish troops in Hungary in 1716, as well as the delivery of the Isle of Corcyre, which was besieged by the Mohammedans a little later. The chaplet is therefore a weapon against the enemies of our souls.

Sister Lucia, visionary of Our Lady at Fatima,

said to Fr. Fuentes on December 26, 1957: “The Most Blessed Virgin Mary, in these end times in which we live, has given a new effectiveness to the recitation of the Rosary, so that there is no temporal or especially spiritual problem, however difficult it may be, concerning the personal life of each one of us, of our families, of the world or of religious communities, or even of the life of peoples and nations; there is no problem, I say, however difficult it may be, that we cannot resolve by praying the Holy Rosary. With the Holy Rosary, we will save ourselves, we will sanctify ourselves, we will console Our Lord, and will obtain the salvation of many souls.”

The efficacy of the Rosary comes from the beauty of the prayers that it contains. The Apostles’ Creed is a summary of the truths of the Catholic Faith; the Our Father is the prayer *par excellence* that Jesus gave to us; the Hail Mary, composed in part of words from Sacred Scripture, makes us admire Mary’s beauty and implore her intercession.

Beyond the prayers that compose it, the Rosary comprises fifteen Mysteries. These describe the spiritual itinerary of Our Lady from the Annunciation until her Coronation in Heaven. They manifest her magnificent journey to God. They also depict the life of Jesus from His entrance into the world to His Ascension.

In contemplating the Mysteries of the Rosary, the believer is invited to ask Jesus through Mary for the virtues that the Divine Teacher and His Mother practiced so well.

Resolutions

- 1 Recite five decades in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary.
- 2 Meditate ten minutes on one of the Mysteries of the Rosary.
- 3 Put into practice the virtue that we lack the most.
